- * PRAYER OF THE DAY P: Let us pray. Gracious God, You set aside Paul and Barnabas for the work of sharing the good news. In the same way, call us into service to you and our neighbors near and far, in Jesus name. Amen.¹

GROWING

Jesus has risen from the grave and ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of God. His work continues through the believers who have been filled with the Holy Spirit. By this time in the church's history, it has been revealed to the leaders that the Good News of salvation through belief in Jesus Christ is for the Gentiles, as well as the Jews. The events of today's readings take place inside of Roman province occupied by Gentiles who have greater knowledge of the Greek gods, than the God of the Jews. Paul and Barnabas have to explain by whose name and power they are able to miraculously heal a man lame since birth. A reading from the Book of Acts, and includes various verses from chapters 13 and 14.

^{13:1} Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the ruler, and Saul. ²While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "*Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.*" ³Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

^{14:8}In Lystra there was a man sitting who could not use his feet and had never walked, for he had been crippled from birth. ⁹He listened to Paul as he was speaking. And Paul, looking at him intently and seeing that he had faith to be healed, ¹⁰said in a loud voice, "Stand upright on your feet." And the man sprang up and began to walk. ¹¹When the crowds saw what Paul had done, they shouted in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have come down to us in human form!" ¹²Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul they called Hermes, because he was the chief speaker. ¹³The priest of Zeus, whose temple was just outside the city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates; he and the crowds wanted to offer sacrifice. ¹⁴When the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard of it, they tore their clothes and rushed out into the crowd, shouting, ¹⁵"Friends, why are you doing this? We are mortals just like you, and we bring you good news, that you should turn from these worthless things to the living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and all that is in them. ¹⁶In past generations he allowed all the nations to follow their own ways; ¹⁷yet he has not left himself without a witness in doing good—giving you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons, and filling you with food and your hearts with joy." ¹⁸Even with these words, they scarcely restrained the crowds from offering sacrifice to them. 
