Please join in reading Psalm 29 responsively.

Psalm: Psalm 29 (NIV)

- ¹ Ascribe to the LORD, you heavenly beings, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.
- ² Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; worship the LORD in the splendor of his holiness.
- ³ The voice of the LORD is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the LORD thunders over the mighty waters.
- ⁴ The voice of the LORD is powerful; the voice of the LORD is majestic.
- ⁵ The voice of the LORD breaks the cedars; the LORD breaks in pieces the cedars of Lebanon.

- ⁶ He makes Lebanon leap like a calf, Sirion like a young wild ox.
- ⁷ The voice of the LORD strikes with flashes of lightning.
- ⁸ The voice of the LORD shakes the desert; the LORD shakes the Desert of Kadesh.
- ⁹ The voice of the LORD twists the oaks^[c] and strips the forests bare. And in his temple all cry, "Glory!"
- ¹⁰ The LORD sits enthroned over the flood; the LORD is enthroned as King forever.
- ¹¹ The LORD gives strength to his people; the LORD blesses his people with peace.

Our reading today is from Acts 19th chapter.

Acts 19:1-7 (NIV)

In Ephesus, Paul encounters people who had received John's baptism of repentance but had never heard of the Holy Spirit or of baptism in the name of Jesus. After Paul baptizes them, the Holy Spirit comes upon them and empowers them with gifts of the Spirit.

¹ While Apollos was at Corinth, Paul took the road through the interior and arrived at Ephesus. There he found some disciples ² and asked them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" They answered, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." ³ So Paul asked, "Then what baptism did you receive? "John's baptism," they replied. ⁴ Paul said, "John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. He told the people to believe in the one coming after him, that is, in Jesus." ⁵ On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. ⁶ When Paul placed his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied. ⁷ There were about twelve men in all.

Gospel: Mark 1:4-11 (NIV)

Mark's gospel reports the story of Jesus' baptism with some irony: the one on whom the Spirit descends is himself the one who will baptize others with the Holy Spirit.

⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹ At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. ¹¹ And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."
