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GROWING

Our first reading is from the 19th chapter of Leviticus.

First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2, 15-18 NIV

The prophet sings a sad, parable-like love song about the relationship between God and Israel. In The Holiness Code in Leviticus urges people to be holy because God is holy. Holiness is lived out as God's people exercise justice and love in their dealings with one another. We are to love our neighbors as ourselves

¹The Lord spoke to Moses, saying: ²"Speak to the entire assembly of Israel and say to them: `Be holy because I, the Lord your God, am holy. ¹5 "Do not pervert justice; do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly. ¹6 "Do not go about spreading slander among your people. "Do not do anything that endangers your neighbor's life. I am the Lord. ¹7 "Do not hate a fellow Israelite in your heart. Rebuke your neighbor frankly so you will not share in their guilt. ¹8 "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord. ¹9 "Keep my decrees. "Do not mate different kinds of animals. "Do not plant your field with two kinds of seed "Do not wear clothing woven of two kinds of material.

Here ends the first reading.

Please join in reading Psalm 1 responsively.

Psalm: Psalm 1 NIV

- ¹ Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers,
- ² but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night.
- ³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither— whatever they do prospers.
- ⁴ Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away.
- ⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.
- ⁶ For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked leads to destruction.

Our second reading is from the 1st Thessalonians 2nd chapter.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:1-8 NIV

Paul uses maternal imagery to depict the caring and nurturing relationship he shares with the *Thessalonian Christians. When he first came to their city it was not to benefit himself but to share the gospel with them, which was his responsibility as an apostle of Christ.*

¹You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, ²but though we had already suffered and been shamefully mistreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. ³For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, ⁴but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. ⁵As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; ⁶nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, ¹though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. ⁸So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

Here ends the second reading.

The Holy Gospel according to Matthew 22nd chapter.

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-46

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

Put on the spot by the Pharisees, Jesus displays wisdom by summarizing the law of God in just two commandments and by demonstrating the Messiah must be more than the son of David.

34When the Pharisees heard that [Jesus] had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, 35and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. 36"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" 37He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' 38This is the greatest and first commandment. 39And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' 40On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." 41Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: 42"What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." 43He said to them, "How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying, 44"The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet"? 45If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?" 46No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.
