WELCOME/INTRODUCTION OF "Christmas Around the World" Advent Theme ADVENT WREATH READING/LIGHTING/SINGING

Reader: As we begin our celebration of Advent, we focus our attention on the Advent wreath here in our church. Similar wreaths can be found in Christian churches all around the world. We light candles at Advent and place lights on our Christmas tree to remind us – and everyone who sees them-that Jesus is the light of the world!

People: Dear God, the lights of the season remind us of how Jesus came here on Earth to teach us all about your love, bring us the gift of your mercy, and lead us to heaven. In the weeks ahead, we will make time to remember how precious we all are to God. Amen.

Reader: In Germany and Denmark candles are lit on Advent wreaths. In Ukraine, families light a candle in a loaf of bread and place it in the middle of their table. In Brazil, gigantic trees made of lights can be see all over. In Argentina, families float 'globos,' paper balloons lit from inside, high into the air.

People: Dear Jesus, may every light we see this Advent remind us of your great love for us and for all people, everywhere. Help us shine your love to others through our words and actions. Amen. 1 Away in a manger, no crib for his bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head; the stars in the sky looked down where he lay; the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

GATHERING

* P: The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ , the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **And also with you.**

- * OPENING LITANY (Please respond with **bold text**)
- L: Our faith is in the creator of heaven and earth; **I believe in God, the Father almighty**
- L: God so loved the created, that he sent his only Son; I believe in Jesus Christ, who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.
- L: Jesus came to this world to teach us to love God and one another, and how to live well with and love our neighbors. He came with a mission from our creator; **He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.**
- L: But death and sin had no hold on him, and so he went on to proclaim this good news; **He descended into hell.* On the third day he rose again.**
- L: And then it was time for the believers to continue Jesus' work from the Father, so He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
- L: But as promised, God sent an Advocate, a helper for the universal Christian Church. **I believe in** the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen *Or, He descended to the dead.
- * P: The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**
- * PRAYER OF THE DAY Let us pray. Eternal and loving light, shine in our hearts and shine through our lives. Jesus, light of the world, scatter the darkness of our ignorance, allow your mercy to be upon us, and flow through us. In this Advent season, we look for your face in the people around us, and ask that our lives may reflect your goodness. Amen.

GROWING

Upon Timothy's report from the congregation at Thessalonica, Paul is filled with gratitude for the believers in this city. In this passage from his letter, Paul voices overflowing thanks, joy, and blessings for the people of this growing church. While this message was written for a community of believers that existed thousands of years ago, its message of longing to 'see the people 'face to face' is one we can relate to for our own church family. Listen for a message God has for us today. A reading from the Apostle Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, chapter 3, beginning at verse 9.

9How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy that we feel before our God because of you? 10 Night and day we pray most earnestly that we may see you face to face and restore whatever is lacking in your faith.

¹¹Now may our God and Father himself and our Lord Jesus direct our way to you. ¹²And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in love for you. ¹³And may he so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints. The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

God will fulfill God's purposes and, already, hidden signs of that fulfillment abound. On that great day there will be dismay, perplexity, confusion, and terror, but God's people shall be given strength to stand boldly and receive God's promised redemption. These are Jesus' words to his disciples, not long before the day of his arrest and death. It's a message of a time to come, and the waiting that is part of faithful living.

The Gospel according to Luke, the 21st chapter. All: Glory to you O Lord.

[Jesus said:] ²⁵"There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. ²⁶People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. ²⁸Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

²⁹Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; ³⁰as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. ³¹So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. ³²Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. ³³Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.


