Dear fellow life and faith travelers,

*Summer Sermon Series on the BOOK of ACTS*

Have you ever wondered what it was like for the apostles and other followers of Jesus, to continue his work after his resurrection and ascension? Not only did they find themselves living into the reality that he is no longer with them, but what Jesus and the Holy Spirit reveal to the faithful is SHOCKING...this *Good News of salvation and the Kingdom of God* is to be spread to *all people...of every nation!* Not only will this be a logistical endeavor of godly proportions, but it will require the hearts and minds of the faithful to reimagine WHO God is calling to be part of it all; as well as HOW they will all live, worship, and work together to fulfill God's will and the Great Commission. As we hear these Bible text, my prayer (Pr. Mary) is that we will hear what future God is calling us into.

As we've already heard in the readings of Acts 1-3, the life and work of the church...**with Jesus and the Spirit empowering and enlightening believers...is changing lives!** The absence of these *'big moment/miraculous occurrences'* in the church (or our personal lives) today doesn't mean the Spirit is not working. But what I (Pastor Mary) have learned over the years, is that the more we allow ourselves to be looking and listening for the Holy Spirit, the more obvious the Spirit's presence and message is experienced/heard. Think about how this is true in so many other areas of our lives: when we are looking for information about our health, wealth, work, or hobbies...our minds and ears are more likely to be tuned into this information as we listen/read the news, books, online blogs, social media and daily conversations.

Throughout this Summer Sermon Series, we will focus our thoughts on three key questions:

1. What is God doing in these events and in the lives of the people/world?
2. How are the people responding to/reacting to God's words/actions?
3. What does all this tell us about what God is calling US (as a congregation, family unit, and/or individual) to do or be in the world today?

From there go to the top right of the page to "**Sign in or Sign Up**". You will be directed to a secured site from Vanco to set up an account so funds can be withdrawn from your checking or savings account. You can set up a one-time or reoccurring offering/donation. You are in control of how much and when you want to donate! You can contact us at the church to make sure the account set up and first donation came through alright. These transactions are all tracked in your giving record and including in your giving statement for tax purposes. This is an easy way to ensure the donation you are making for God's work is placed into the church account. Start small if you like, and then build on your generosity as time goes on. (You can ignore the pop message that ask you to download a mobile app for GivePlus)
